Swim Ireland is the National Governing Body (NGB) for aquatic disciplines providing opportunities for young people though involvement and participation in swimming, water polo and diving activities operating at club, regional and national levels, under the under the Swim Ireland Safeguarding Policy. Our organisation believes that the best interests of children and young people attending our sport are paramount and believe that all children in our sport environments have the right to be protected, treated with respect, listened to and to have their views taken into consideration in all decisions affecting them.

We will review our guiding principles and child safeguarding procedures every two years or sooner if necessary due to organisational issues or changes in legislation or national policy.
